## Annex A

In decision notice FER0541832 the Commissioner ordered the disclosure of the following:

- (i) Document 2 paragraphs 5 and 6 save for the third and fourth sentences of paragraph 6;
- (ii) Document 5 paragraphs 5; 6; 9 and 10;
- (iii) Document 7 paragraph 4; and
- (iv) The information redacted from the headers of documents 1; 2; 3; 5; 6 and 7.

The FCO appealed against the material decision notice and in so doing made a late claim of regulation 12(5)(a) in relation to parts of the information which it had been ordered to disclose namely:

- (i) Document 2 one sentence in paragraph 5;
- (ii) Document 5 one sentence in paragraphs 6 and 9;
- (iii) Document 7 paragraph 4; and
- (iv) The information contained in the headers of documents 3; 5 and 6.

The Commissioner considered his position on the late claim of regulation 12(5)(a). The Commissioner concluded that the exception was engaged and that the public interest test favoured non-disclosure of the majority of paragraph 4 within document 7. However, the Commissioner found that the exception was not engaged in relation to a small number of particular words within paragraph 4 of document 7 or the other information to which it has been applied. The Commissioner also accepted that some references in the headers of documents should remain redacted.

The FCO accepts the Commissioner's findings.

The requester has also been contacted and does not seek to challenge the position which has now been agreed between the parties.
