THEIR Lordships are of opinion that it is impossible that this Judgment should be allowed to stand. The Attorney-General has most properly admitted that the whole proceedings were from the first irregular, and therefore the only Order their Lordships think should be made is that this Conviction and Sentence should be quashed; and they will humbly advise His Majesty accordingly.
