



CHAPTER 21.

An Act to amend the Ground Game Act, 1880.

[4th August 1906.]

A.D. 1906.

BE it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the Ground Game (Amendment) short title Act, 1906; and the expressions "occupier" and "ground game" and interpreas used in this Act shall have the same meaning as they have tation. in the Ground Game Act. 1880.

2. Notwithstanding anything in section one, subsection (3), Extension of of the Ground Game Act, 1880, contained, the occupier of lands right of occuto which that subsection applies shall, without prejudice to his lands, &c. to existing rights under that Act, be entitled, between the first day kill ground of September and the tenth day of December, both inclusive, game. in any and every year, to exercise the right of killing and taking ground game by the said Act conferred otherwise than by the use of firearms.

3. Section three of the Ground Game Act, 1880, shall not Agreements apply to prevent the occupier of lands to which section one, cupiers and subsection (3), of that Act applies, and the owner of such lands owners of or other persons having a right to take and kill game thereon moorlands, from making and enforcing agreements for the joint exercise, or the exercise for their joint benefit, of the right to kill and take ground game between the first day of September and the tenth day of December, both inclusive, in any or every year.

4. This Act shall come into operation on the first day of Commencement of Act. April nineteen hundred and seven.
