ROAD TRAFFIC

**The A35 Trunk Road (Kingston Ponds, Near Dorchester, Dorset)
(Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011**

Made - - - - *6th June 2011*

Coming into force - - *10th June 2011*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the A35 Trunk Road, is satisfied that traffic on a length of that road at Kingston Ponds, near Dorchester in the County of Dorset should be prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon.

NOW THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1) (a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 (a), hereby makes the following Order:

1. This Order may be cited as the A35 Trunk Road (Kingston Ponds, Near Dorchester, Dorset) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2011 and shall come into force on 10th June.

2. In this Order -

“layby” means an area of carriageway intended for the waiting of vehicles and bounded partly by a road marking on the outer edge of that carriageway complying with diagram 1010 in Schedule 6 to the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 2002(b) and in this definition “carriageway” means any way (other than a cycle track) comprised in the trunk road over which the public have a right of way for the passage of vehicles and which has a surface suitable for the exercise of that right;

“the works” means works to refurbish the toilet block situated in the layby;

“the works period” means the period starting at 09.00 hours on Monday 13th June 2011 and ending when the works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in article 4 no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter, proceed or remain in the layby adjacent to the eastbound carriageway of the A35 Trunk Road situated 1660 metres east of Stinsford roundabout, Dorchester.

4. The provisions of article 3 shall not apply to -

- (i) a vehicle being used in connection with the said works;
- (ii) a vehicle being used at the direction, or with the permission, of a constable or a traffic officer in uniform;

- (iii) A vehicle being used for police, traffic officer, fire and rescue or ambulance purposes.
