**The M6 Motorway (Junction 10a to 9) (Temporary Restriction
and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013**

Made - - - - - *5th June 2013*

Coming into force - - - - - *12th June 2013*

WHEREAS the Secretary of State for Transport, being the traffic authority for the M6 Motorway (“the M6”), is satisfied that traffic on lengths of that motorway in the County of Staffordshire, should be restricted and prohibited because works are proposed to be executed thereon:

NOW, THEREFORE, the Secretary of State, in exercise of the powers conferred by section 14 (1)(a) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984(a) and regulation 16(2) of the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b), hereby makes the following Order:-

1. This Order may be cited as the M6 Motorway (Junction 10a to 9) (Temporary Restriction and Prohibition of Traffic) Order 2013 and shall come into force on 12th June 2013.

2. In this Order –

“the first length of motorway” means on the southbound carriageway of M6 from a point 400 metres south of the centreline of the Bentley Lane overbridge to a point 100 metres north of its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 9;

“the second length of motorway” means the southbound carriageway of the M6 from a point 700 metres north of its junction with the exit slip road at Junction 9, to a point 100 metres north of that junction;

“the Regulations” means the Motorways Traffic (England and Wales) Regulations 1982(b);

“a hard shoulder” means the hard shoulder, within the meaning of Regulation 3(1)(e) of the Regulations, which is adjacent to the second length of motorway;

“the works period” means the period starting at 22:00 hours on Wednesday 19th June 2013 and ending when the said works have been completed;

and a reference to an article followed by a number is a reference to the article in this Order which bears that number.

3. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, drive any motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 50 miles per hour in the first length of motorway.

4. Subject as mentioned in articles 5 and 6, no person shall, during the works period, cause or permit any vehicle to enter or proceed in the second length of motorway.

5. The provisions of articles 3 and 4 shall apply only during such times and to such extent as shall from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.

6. The provisions of:

(a) articles 3 and 4 shall not apply to any vehicle -

(i) being used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes, or

(ii) proceeding at the direction of, or with the permission of, a police constable;

(b) article 3 shall not apply to any vehicle being used for special forces purposes; and

(c) article 4 shall not apply to any vehicle being used in connection with the said works or by a traffic officer in uniform.

7. During the works period, regulations 5 and (in so far as it relates to a vehicle being driven) 9 of the Regulations are hereby suspended in respect of a hard shoulder, at such times and to such extent as may from time to time be indicated by traffic signs.
