CIVIL AVIATION

The Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal Air Force Odiham) Regulations 2024

Made - - - - 10th June 2024

Coming into force - - 9th August 2024

The Secretary of State has decided that it is necessary in the public interest to restrict flying in the area specified in regulation 3(1) by reason of the intended holding of flying displays that are scheduled to take place there.

The Secretary of State makes the following Regulations in exercise of the powers conferred by article 239 of the Air Navigation Order 2016(a).

Citation and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Air Navigation (Restriction of Flying) (Royal Air Force Odiham) Regulations 2024 and they come into force on 9th August 2024.

Interpretation

2. In regulation 3(1) the times referred to are Co-ordinated Universal Time(**b**).

Restricted airspace

- **3.**—(1) Subject to paragraph (2), between 1100 hours and 1700 hours on 9th August 2024 no aircraft is to fly below 4,000 feet above mean sea level within the area bounded by a circle having a radius of 3 nautical miles whose centre is at 511405N 0005657W.
 - (2) Paragraph (1) does not apply to any aircraft—
 - (a) operating in accordance with a clearance issued by the—
 - (i) air traffic control unit at Royal Air Force Odiham,
 - (ii) air traffic control unit at Farnborough Airport, or
 - (iii) Royal Air Force Odiham air show flying display director, or
 - (b) operated by or on behalf of the—
 - (i) National Police Air Service, or
 - (ii) Helicopter Emergency Medical Services.

⁽b) Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations impose restrictions on flying in the vicinity of Royal Air Force Odiham, Hampshire during air displays that are due to take place there on 9th August 2024.

Many aircraft will be involved in high energy manoeuvres during the displays and therefore the Civil Aviation Authority and the Department for Transport agree that flying should be restricted in the vicinity of the event for reasons of public safety.

The times mentioned in regulation 3(1) are Co-ordinated Universal Time (UTC) which is one hour behind British Summer Time (BST).

In relation to the permissions mentioned in regulation 3(2)(a), the air traffic control units at Royal Air Force Odiham and Farnborough Airport, and the Royal Air Force Odiham air show flying display director may be contacted as notified.

Full details of this Statutory Instrument will be promulgated by Aeronautical Information Circular (AIC) and Notice to Aviation (NOTAM).
